## **ENVIRONMENTAL AND SOCIAL COMMITMENT PLAN**

- The Government of Balochistan (the Borrower) will implement the Getting Results: Access and Delivery of Quality Education Services in Balochistan (GRADES-B) (the Project), with the involvement of Project Management Unit-School Education Department (PMU-SED), Government of Balochistan. The International Development Association (the World Bank) will provide the financing (P507512) for the Project.
- The Borrower shall ensure that the Project is carried out in accordance with the Environmental and Social Standards (ESSs) and this Environmental and Social Commitment Plan (ESCP), in a manner acceptable to the World Bank. The ESCP is a part of the Financing Agreement. Unless otherwise defined in this ESCP, capitalized terms used in this ESCP have the meanings ascribed to them in the referred agreement.
- 3. Without limitation to the foregoing, this ESCP sets out material measures and actions that the Borrower shall carry out or cause to be carried out, including, as applicable, the timeframes of the actions and measures, institutional, staffing, training, monitoring, and reporting arrangements, and grievance management. The ESCP also sets out the environmental and social (E&S) instruments that shall be adopted and implemented under the Project, all of which shall be subject to prior consultation and disclosure, consistent with the ESS, and in form and substance, and in a manner acceptable to the World Bank. Once adopted, said E&S instruments may be revised from time to time with prior written agreement by the World Bank.
- 4. As agreed by the World Bank and the Borrower, this ESCP will be revised from time to time if necessary, during Project implementation, to reflect adaptive management of Project changes and unforeseen circumstances or in response to Project performance. In such circumstances, the Borrower through Government of Balochistan; and the World Bank agree to update the ESCP to reflect these changes through an exchange of letters signed between the World Bank and Borrower. The Borrower shall promptly disclose the updated ESCP.
- 5. The subsection on 'Indicators for Implementation Readiness' below identifies the actions and measures to be monitored to assess Project readiness to begin implementation in accordance with this ESCP. Nevertheless, all actions and measures in this ESCP shall be implemented as set out in the 'Timeframe' column below irrespective of whether they are listed in the referred subsection.
